Objectives

- To provide presentations of the most recent developments in craniofacial surgery with reviews and analyses of ongoing treatment plans for patients having craniofacial congenital anomalies, post traumatic abnormalities and tumors. Newest advances, including genetics, and minimally invasive surgical procedures for the treatment of the abnormalities will be discussed.
- Increase awareness of the multi-disciplinary approach to diagnosis and treatment of patients with craniofacial abnormalities.
- To provide a forum of predominately free papers followed by open discussion.
- To consider the analysis of facial form and related aesthetic topics.

Audio-Visual Equipment
